



# 2007 Canadian Engineers' AWARDS

The Canadian Engineers' Awards recognize individual engineers and engineering students for their contributions to the engineering profession and to Canadian society. Seven exceptional individuals received awards in 2007.

#### Gold Medal Award

**Dr. Robert L. Papineau, PhD, ing. (OIQ)**  
One of the great figures of engineering education in Quebec's universities, his achievements have helped shape two of the major engineering institutions in the province: the École de technologie supérieure and the École polytechnique de Montréal. As director general of both schools, Dr. Papineau continues to adapt the engineering profession to future challenges.



#### Meritorious Service Award for Community Service

**R. Charles Terreault, ing. (OIQ)**  
After a remarkable career as a researcher, manager, teacher and senior telecommunications consultant, R. Charles Terreault now devotes his time and talent to ensuring that Quebec hospitals benefit from the services of Dr. Clown, a non-profit humanitarian organization inspired by the philosophy of Dr. Patch Adams.



#### Meritorious Service Award for Professional Service

**Hollis B. Cole, P.Eng. (APEGNB)**  
Dedicated to protecting and promoting the field of engineering in Atlantic Canada, Hollis B. Cole's selfless contributions to the profession have been ongoing since he received his professional accreditation 30 years ago. He is a past-president of the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of New Brunswick (APEGNB) and a past-president of Engineers Canada.



#### Award for the Support of Women in the Engineering Profession

**Claudia Ng, P.Eng. (APEGBC)**  
With her "anything is possible" outlook on life, Claudia Ng is widely recognized as an inspirational entrepreneur and role model for women in the field of engineering. She devotes much of her time mentoring young people through her work with the Wired Woman society and S.U.C.C.E.S.S.



#### Medal for Distinction in Engineering Education

**Kimberly A. Woodhouse, PhD, P.Eng. (PEO)**  
Dean of the Faculty of Applied Science at Queen's University, Dr. Woodhouse is considered a superb educator who has shaped the teaching style within the faculty and the curriculum itself. Her recent appointment as the university's dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences is testament to the impact she has made.



#### Young Engineer Achievement Award

**Sridhar Krishnan, P.Eng. (PEO), PhD**  
At just 35 years of age, Dr. Krishnan is chair of the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at Ryerson University. Responsible for the delivery of five degree programs, he has made substantial contributions to the establishment of a successful graduate program and co-ordinated the first-ever accreditation of the B.Eng. program in computer engineering at Ryerson.



#### Gold Medal Student Award

**Alejandro Gómez-Juliao**  
A third-year electrical engineering student at the University of New Brunswick, Mr. Gómez-Juliao devotes much of his time and energy doing school outreach work and raising funds for Engineers Without Borders – an organization in which engineers apply their expertise to further humanitarian efforts.
