## 2012 Engineers Canada Awards

*Presented annually, the awards honour engineering excellence, outstanding community and professional involvement, contributions to engineering education, support for women in engineering, contributions by engineers and engineering students to Canadian society, and remarkable engineering projects or achievements.*

The **Gold Medal Award\*** for exceptional achievement and distinction in a field of engineering.

The **Young Engineer Achievement Award\*** for outstanding contribution in a field of engineering by an engineer 35 years of age or younger.

The **Meritorious Service Award for Professional Service\*** for outstanding contribution to a professional, consulting or technical engineering association or society in Canada.

The **Meritorious Service Award for Community Service\*** for exemplary voluntary contribution to a community organization or humanitarian endeavour.

The **Medal for Distinction in Engineering Education\*** for exemplary contribution to engineering teaching at a Canadian university.

The **National Award for an Engineering Project or Achievement\*** for outstanding engineering projects or achievements by an engineering team in which Canadian engineers were involved.

The **Award for the Support of Women in the Engineering Profession\*** for outstanding support of women in the engineering profession and engineering excellence.

The **Gold Medal Student Award\*\*** for outstanding leadership, contributions to society, and volunteerism by an undergraduate engineering student.

**The deadline for receipt of nominations is 4 p.m. EST on Friday, January 6, 2012.**

**Awards recipients will be honoured at Engineers Canada's Awards Gala in Niagara Falls, Ontario, on Saturday, June 2, 2012.**

\*All nominees must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents of Canada. They must also be registered in good standing with one of the 12 provincial/territorial engineering licensing bodies.

Engineers Canada will accept nominations from any interested parties provided that the nominees have met all of the selection criteria.
